## Important Information

- STÁUTW Road will be closed as a through route between Tetayut Rd. and Longhouse Rd.
- This is a full 24/7 road closure
- Longhouse Lane/Road remains accessible via the “other side” of STÁUTW (toward Church/Pullock) for local access only.
- Residents and the Longhouse can still be reached, but there is no through traffic between Tetayut and Longhouse during the works.
- Pedestrian traffic on the sidewalk will remain open.
- All signs will be maintained regularly to allow for maximum visibility and will remain clear of any materials that may reduce their visibility.
- All signage will be set up to command the respect of vehicles, cyclists, and pedestrians to ensure the safety of both the travelling public and the workers.

## MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE – CALL FOR EXPRESSION OF INTEREST

STÁUTW First Nation is seeking to appoint members to the Tsawout First Nation Membership Committee who shall each have the opportunity to serve a two-year term from date of appointment.

Thea STÁUTW First Nation Membership Law (2013) says the following regarding vacancy in term:

**18.1** A membership Committee of seven (7) members, all of whom are at least eighteen (18) years of age and none of whom are members of Council will be appointed by Council.

**18.2** Appointments to the Tsawout First Nation Membership Committee will be made in a manner so as to provide for a broad representation of the Tsawout First Nation community. At least two (2) SELWÁN and one (1) youth member will be appointed to the committee.

**SELWAN** means an adult person who is a member of the STÁUTW First Nation and who has gained and continues to hold the trust, respect and confidence of the STÁUTW First Nation and who has a good knowledge of the customs of the STÁUTW First Nation.

**Youth Member** means a member who is between the ages of eighteen (18) and twenty-five (25).

### ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Any eligible voter, whether or not resident on Tsawout reserve lands, is eligible to be appointed to the Tsawout First Nation Membership Committee.

### COMMITTEE RESPONSIBILITIES AND ACCOUNTABILITIES

The Tsawout First Nation Membership Committee's responsibilities include the following, as set out in the STÁUTW First Nation Membership Law (2013) and at the instruction of the Lands Manager:

- Meet at least quarterly to consider applications for membership and provide written recommendations (along with reasons for those decisions) to Council regarding the acceptance of membership applications.
- Assess and make decisions with regard to whether a person applying for membership has a criminal record that disqualifies them from becoming a member.
- Hear appeals from decisions made by the Tsawout First Nation Membership Administrator and make written recommendations (along with reasons for those decisions) to Council on the matter under appeal.

# Community News

The Tsawout First Nation Membership Committee must act in accordance with all Tsawout First Nation Laws and Policies, including the STÁUTW First Nation Membership Law (2013), Tsawout First Nation Financial Administration Law, and any other Tsawout First Nation laws and polices that generally apply to Tsawout First Nation committees. The Membership Administrator provides administrative support to the Tsawout First Nation Membership Committee and acts as the liaison between the Tsawout First Nation Membership Committee and Council.

## SELECTION CRITERIA

The STÁUTW First Nation Membership Law (2013) states that the Membership Committee will be appointed by Council in a manner so as to provide for a broad representation of the Tsawout First Nation community. Council will appoint no more than five (5) members to the Tsawout First Nation Membership Committee, taking into consideration the importance of:

- Having at least one (1) youth representative.
- Ensuring there is elder representative.
- Ensuring that there is broad family representation.
- Ensuring that there is broad skillset of those represented on the Tsawout First Nation Membership Committee.

## TIME COMMITMENT AND COMPENSATION

The Tsawout First Nation Membership Committee is an ad hoc panel, and all of its work must remain within the Tsawout First Nation's annual budget. The Compensation for Committee members is set by Council.

BC Hydro will be completing pole replacement work at 2899 Mt Newton X Rd on Tuesday, February 3, beginning at 10:00 a.m.

## Exploring a Potential Partnership Opportunity

Tsawout First Nation is exploring a partnership opportunity grounded in long-term stewardship and shared values.

Tsawout leadership is in early discussions with Westbow Group of Companies about a potential partnership that would bring more than 200 acres of land into Tsawout's reserve. This opportunity is focused on creating lasting economic strength for future generations through carefully planned development.

Westbow Group is a family-owned company with a long history of working alongside communities to build places that create lasting value. Guided by a commitment to partnership, respect for the land, and giving back, Westbow approaches development with a long-term lens—prioritizing sustainability, relationships, and community benefit.

Any partnership would be shaped by Tsawout values, priorities, and leadership.

Transparency and community voice are central to this process. Westbow Group will be hosting a series of engagement sessions in January for Tsawout members to share details about the proposed partnership, answer questions, and hear feedback directly from the community.

Following these engagement sessions, Tsawout members will determine whether to support moving forward with this partnership. Engagement dates and times will be shared soon.



# Fisheries Update

## Crab & Clam Harvesting

Over the past weeks, Fisheries has been busy crab fishing, with successful deliveries made to Elders and a community pick-up day - thank you to everyone who came out, they went quick!

We also recently hosted a clam digging night with community, and it was great to be out on the beach together sharing knowledge and harvesting. We plan to continue organizing more outings like this and encourage everyone to come out and join us when they happen.



## Salmon Release with Education Department

Fisheries has been collaborating with Education and currently has a tank set up with 100 chum salmon eggs, which will hatch and be released into Tetayut Creek later this spring.

## Stewardship Gathering on Salt Spring Island

Finally, four Fisheries staff travelled to Salt Spring Island to attend a stewardship gathering with technical staff from the WSÁNEĆ Nations. The gathering focused on sharing stories, identifying overlaps in our work, beach digging and sea garden knowledge sharing, and brainstorming future collaboration opportunities for aligned projects.



# Fisheries Update

## BRUV System

This month, Fisheries worked with DFO to develop training videos for using a Bait Remote Underwater Video (BRUV) system. These BRUV's function by having two cameras recording a bait cup to see what fish species are present and what the seafloor is like. With the 2-camera setup, we will be able to not only identify the species of marine organisms but also have an accurate measurement of size.

During this outing, Fisheries got to deploy the system in various locations of QEN,T and got our first look at the seafloor to incorporate into our Dungeness crab surveys.
